Second Collection: There will be a special second collection next week for the Scottish Catholic Education Service (SCES) which promotes and protects our Catholic Schools in issues of national significance and supports our Schools, Parishes and Dioceses.

Collection Baskets: We do not pass the Collection basket from hand to hand during Mass at the Preparation of the Gifts (and for Second Collections) to avoid interrupting everyone's Prayer of Thanksgiving after Communion. So, the Basket for the Offertory Collection will be in the Porch as you enter and the Basket for the various Second Collections - which will be named - will be on the Altar Rail as you leave. Many of you now support the Parish by Standing Order or Electronically (for which Fr. Michael is most grateful) though for many causes the physical collection is their only opportunity for you to offer your financial support. Please continue to offer these causes your support. (If you forget the Offertory Collection on the way in, please leave your donation beside the Second Collection Basket as you leave.)

My Giving Hub: If Parishioners wish to donate to the Parish using the My Giving Hub, they need only scan the QR code at the top of the bulletin and decide the amount.

Live Streaming: Services are Live Streamed and can be viewed on our YouTube Channel. Weekday Services will be available until 11.59pm on the day they are "live". An edited version of the Sunday Morning Mass will be uploaded to view later.

Armistice Day Service: A Service will be held at the proposed site for the War Memorial on Monday, 11th November at 10.50am. All are welcome to attend.

As Fr. Michael is away this week, there will be a Service of the Word with Holy Communion on Tuesday and Friday mornings at 10.00am.

November Lists: Please find available the Envelopes and November Lists at the door for us to remember in Prayer at Mass each day of November the Souls of our Faithful Departed. As is our custom, November is a month of special prayer for those gone to God and many of us wish our family members especially remembered. If you complete the list with the names of your dead and hand in the sealed envelope with your offering within, Fr. Michael will open them, place the lists on the Sanctuary and remember them in Mass each day of the month.

Book Of Remembrance: For the month of November, when we remember our dearly departed, we will have our November Lists (as other notice) for our family members, additionally we have all given back to God many known to us in various ways. To commemorate them and to speak of their presence in our minds and hearts, we have a Book of Remembrance available in the Porch. Please add any names you wish, and we will pray for them as a Parish Community in November - this is to replace our remembrance with lighting of individual candles as, due to COVID, we have all lost so many friends. Requiescant in Pace!

16th to 24th November Is Catholic Education Week and a variety of events are planned. On the weekend of 16th / 17th we will have a brief presentation from the Staff and Pupils of our Schools to speak of their mission and method, we will also have a special collection that weekend. Among the events in our Schools will be a "Prayer Breakfast" in St. Benedict's at 8.30am on Friday, 22nd. The School have invited Fr. Michael (and other local Priests) and a few parishioners from each Parish to participate in this. If you would like to participate, please speak to Fr. Michael who will take you to and from the School that day.

New Lectionary: We will have a new translation of the Scriptures to be used from the First Sunday of Advent (1st / 2nd December). We therefore have to buy new Lectionaries and Book Of The Gospels (the Book the Readers use for the Readings and Fr. Michael uses for the Gospel). A very generous donor has made a big donation already - in Memory of a loved one who has died, this will cover the cost of the main volumes but we need to buy some additional volumes. If anyone would like to donate, please have a word with Fr. Michael who can discuss it with you - thank you in advance for your generosity!

Financial Support: Thanks to your continued generosity in October, Fr. Michael received £2,300 from the contributions to the weekly Offertory Collection which you have made with envelopes and donations. He also received second collection contributions of £471 for Missio Scotland. The Building Fund collection in October amounted to £500. Your ongoing generous support of the Parish by envelopes, donations, standing orders or through the Diocesan debit / credit card portal is greatly appreciated as it enables us to continue to function despite all the challenges that these days bring.
