We Will Have a new translation of the Lectionary (the book we use for the Scripture readings at Mass) from the First Sunday in Advent, so you will notice a few differences from the readings we have heard most of our lives. There is also a new Sunday Missal (which has all the Readings, Prayers and other parts of the Mass) being produced. These will be available at a cost of £18.99. Fr. Michael will be able to get some at a pre-publication price of £15.00. We will have to order these in advance, so if you would like to order one, please sign up in the Porch and we will get them delivered.

Food Parcels: Fr. Michael would like to repeat his word of thanks to you all for your ongoing generous support of the most needy in the Town. Your continued donations of food, toiletries, laundry liquid and cash mean that we have been able to distribute 830 food parcels! This tells us two things; you are unfailingly generous and thoughtful and there is a serious need in our community. Many thanks indeed for such a powerful witness to our Parish's commitment to the Gospel!

Collection Envelopes: If any members of the Parish Community would like to join the Gift Aid Scheme, sealed Gift Aid Packs are available in the House Porch. Please take the sealed pack home with you. The Gift Aid Declaration (GAD) Form should then be completed and the signed GAD Form posted in the Parish House.

PAYAcharity provides our online giving platform which was set up during the Covid 19 pandemic when Covid restrictions resulted in the temporary closure of our Churches. It continues to provide an invaluable source of income for the parishes raising approximately £60,000.00 per annum. Unfortunately, PAYAcharity have now advised us that they are withdrawing PAYAcharity account services to charities with effect from 16th September 2024. The QR codes will cease to operate from this date. Many parishioners have set up recurring payments via the PAYAcharity platform which will also cease on this date. We therefore ask parishioners who currently make regular donations via the PAYAcharity online giving to set up a new payment to the parish using their online banking service. If you do not have access to online banking and prefer to set up a standing order manually, standing order forms are available from the Diocesan website (see below) or from your parish priest. Taxpayers who wish to claim gift aid tax relief on their donations should also complete a gift aid declaration which are available from the Diocesan website: https://tinyurl.com/ypmyy96n or from your parish priest.

We do intend to set up new QR codes shortly for a new online platform such as JustGiving Accounts to fundraise in future. However, as there is a commission charged on each donation, we would ask you to consider making your regular offertory donations directly to the parish. We would like to take this opportunity to thank you all for your ongoing support of our parishes.
