In Advent - the beginning of the new Liturgical Year (Sunday, 1st December 2024) - the new Lectionary will come into use. The Lectionary is the book that contains the Scripture readings for Mass and the Sacraments. It is changing as part of the continuing process of revising liturgical translations. The process began with the Roman Missal in 2011 and has continued with all the other liturgical texts. This unfortunately means that all Lectionaries (and the Book of the Gospels) in St. Conval's will need to be replaced. This will come to a total cost of £1,480.00. As it happens, we need to replace our Clavinova (the Electric Organ) as our present one gave up the ghost two weeks ago - this will cost 4,345 Euro (plus import duties and taxes - thanks to Brexit!). Proving that it never rains but it pours, Fr. Michael was informed this morning, that as a result of our recent Boiler Service, it seems very likely that a new Boiler will be required in the Church for this Winter (cost approx. £6,000.00). Fr. Michael will be appealing to you in the coming months to help with these additional (and mainly unforeseen) costs to the Parish.
